

1) I worked for thirty years
as a stage director at the
Metropolitan Opera in New York
(where I was responsible for over
twenty operas and seven new or
revised productions) and also directed
at almost all the opera companies
in North America, several in South
America and a few European ones
like the Opéra de Monte Carlo.

assistant for the one opera ("Vespri
Siciliani" in Torino) she directed.
